



The *Duchy of Cornwall* map (ca. 1286) belongs to a series of Anglo-French early medieval *mappae mundi* that include the *Munich Isidorian T-O map* (1130, #205), the *Psalter map* (ca. 1262, #223), the *Ebstorf map* (ca. 1300, #224), the *Hereford map* (ca. 1300, #226), the *Ramsey Abbey Higden map* (ca. 1350, #232), the *Aslake map* (ca. 1360).
